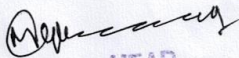

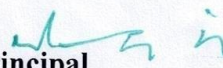

Seminar Report on "Mouryan's Administration - Principles of Ashoka Dhamma"

Introduction:

The Department of History, Andhra Christian College, Guntur, organized a seminar on "Mouryan's Administration - Principles of Ashoka Dhamma" for the II B. A. students. The seminar aimed to delve into the administrative strategies of the Mouryan Empire, particularly under Emperor Ashoka, and to understand the principles of Ashoka Dhamma.

Seminar Proceedings:

The seminar began with an introduction by Mr. M. Siril Kumar, Head of the Department of History. He welcomed the students and faculty and highlighted the importance of understanding ancient Indian administration and the ethical governance principles promoted by Ashoka.

Session by Mr. B. Chennaiah:

Mr. B. Chennaiah, the resource person for the seminar, delivered an insightful lecture on the Mouryan administration and the principles of Ashoka Dhamma. His key points included:

1. Centralized Administration:

The Mouryan Empire under Chandragupta Maurya and his advisor Chanakya established a highly centralized form of government.

The role of provinces (Janapadas) and the appointment of provincial governors (Kumara) was discussed.

2. Revenue System:

The systematic revenue collection process, including land tax (Bhaga) and trade duties, was explained.

The importance of a well-organized bureaucracy in the administration of vast territories was emphasized.

3. Military Organization:

The structure of the Mouryan military, including infantry, cavalry, elephants, and chariots, was detailed.

The strategic importance of maintaining a strong and disciplined army was highlighted.

4. Ashoka's Dhamma:

Mr. Chennaiah elaborated on Ashoka's transformation after the Kalinga War and his subsequent adoption of Buddhism.

The principles of Ashoka Dhamma, including non-violence (Ahimsa), tolerance, and welfare measures for the people, were discussed.

The significance of Ashoka's edicts as tools for communicating his policies and moral teachings to his subjects was analyzed.

5. Public Welfare:

Initiatives such as the establishment of hospitals, rest houses, and the planting of shade trees along roadsides were mentioned as examples of Ashoka's concern for public welfare.

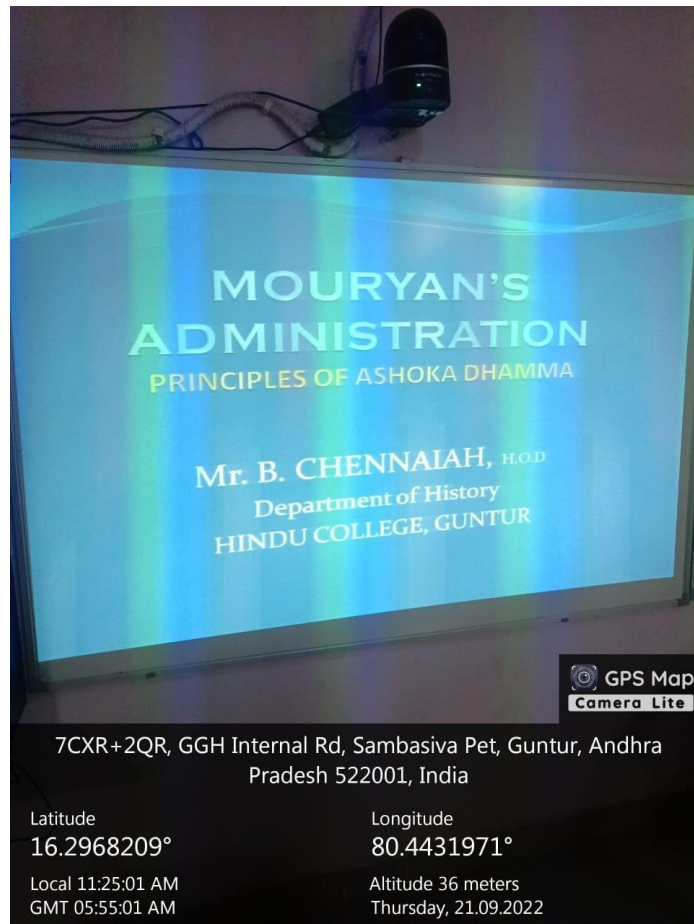
The role of Dhamma Mahamatras (officers of Dhamma) in promoting ethical behaviour and social harmony was explored.

Following the lecture, an interactive session was held where students posed questions to Mr. B. Chennaiah. The resource person provided detailed and thoughtful responses, enriching the students' understanding of the subject.

Chennaiah for his enlightening lecture and to all the faculty members and students for their active participation. 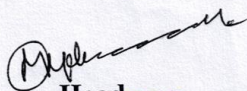

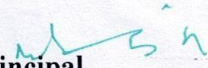
