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What is the communicative method in English?
 The communicative approach is based on the idea that learning language successfully comes through having to communicate real meaning. When learners are involved in real communication, their natural strategies for language acquisition will be used, and this will allow them to learn to use the language.

Example:- Practising question forms by asking learners to find out personal information about their colleagues is an example of the communicative approach, as it involves meaningful communication.

② What is tense in communicative English?

In English language, the word 'tense' is used to denote a characteristic of the verb in a sentence. The tense of a verb is used to depict the particular time in which a specific event is taking place. Tenses are often considered to be the backbone and the most fundamental element of the English language. Without tense, everything seems to be absurd. Tenses help you describe actions that take place at different times. It helps to give clarity to your context and the information you are trying to convey. It also allows you to build complex sentences structures.

In English grammar, there are three main tenses and they are each further classified into four different forms, which sum up to twelve tenses in total. The three tenses in English are:-

- i] present Tense
- ii] Past Tense
- iii] Future Tense

The twelve tenses in English are as follows:-

- i] Simple present Tense
- ii] present continuous Tense
- iii] present perfect Tense
- iv] present perfect continuous Tense
- v] Simple past Tense
- vi] Past continuous Tense
- vii] Past perfect Tense
- viii] Past perfect continuous Tense
- ix] Simple future Tense, x] future continuous Tense
- xi] future perfect Tense
- xii] future perfect continuous Tense.

Paralinguistic features of language are the verbal elements that accompany such as tone of voice, facial expressions, gestures, and Body language. These features contribute to effective communication by adding emphasis, emotion, context to the spoken words.

The four elements of Paralanguage are pitch, volume, tone and rate of speech. These elements play a crucial role in conveying meaning and emotions during communications, often influencing how a message is interpreted by the listener.

Paralinguistics refer to non-verbal elements of communications, such as tone, pitch, volume & facial expression which convey meaning beyond words. Examples include raising one's voice to convey anger, smiling while greeting someone, (3) using hand gestures to emphasise a point.
